



## ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

English is the language of instruction and examination at SIAST.

SIAST applicants who have completed their secondary (high school) education or received post-secondary training in one of the following exempt countries are not generally required to provide evidence of English language proficiency (ELP).

If your first or primary language is not English and/or your country is not exempt, you will need to provide evidence of having the English language skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing necessary to be successful in the SIAST program to which you are applying.

Saskatchewan students graduating from Fransaskois and French Immersion high school programs are not required to meet further ELP requirements.

## SIAST ELP REQUIREMENTS

\* Excludes program-specific requirements listed in subsequent sections

Applicants may be conditionally waitlisted and/or conditionally accepted where proof of registration specifically in SIAST, University of Regina, or University of Saskatchewan English language training is provided in writing. Proof must include a specified date by which the individual is anticipated to meet the ELP requirement.

**Evidence may be demonstrated in one of the following ways.** Each testing service has its own policies concerning re-testing timeframes, etc.

<p>Completion of studies at a Canadian or U.S. high school (<b>secondary</b> education)</p>	<p>A minimum grade of 70% in Grade 12 provincially-examined or state-examined English courses as part of one successful full-time year of study; OR successful completion of Grades 10, 11 and 12 English courses or their equivalents, in sequence, as part of three full academic years in a high school using provincially-accredited Canadian or state-accredited U.S. curriculum, including regular (10, 20 or 30 level) or modified (11, 21 or 31 level) courses. English as a Second Language courses will not be considered. Quebec applicants must provide proof of:  <input type="checkbox"/> a Secondary V Diplôme d'études secondaires (DES) with three successful years of English in sequence, or  <input type="checkbox"/> a minimum of one complete year in an academic diploma program at a French Collège d'enseignement général et professionnel (CEGEP), and two of the following English courses: English 603-101, 603-102, 603-103, or  <input type="checkbox"/> a minimum of one complete year in an academic diploma program at an English CEGEP college</p>
<p>Canadian provincially-examined Adult 12 program (<u>secondary</u> education)</p>	<p>Successful completion of a provincially-examined Adult 12 program, including a minimum grade of 70% in English Language Arts A30 and English language Arts B30 (or equivalent)</p>
<p>U.S. approved Adult 12 program (<u>secondary</u> education)</p>	<p>Successful completion of an approved Adult 12 program, including a minimum grade of 70% in equivalent English courses</p>
<p>Completion of studies at an English-speaking <u>secondary</u> school outside North America in a country that is not exempt</p>	<p>Successful completion of Grades 10, 11, and 12 (or equivalent), in sequence, as part of three full years of secondary school taught and examined at an accredited institution recognized by SIAST, where English is the official language of instruction and examination. Registrar approval will be required.</p>

Completion of studies at an English-speaking <u>post-secondary</u> school	Successful completion of a one-year certificate, diploma or degree from an accredited program and institution recognized by SIAST, where English is the official language of instruction and examination. Registrar approval will be required.

Proficiency equivalents will be reviewed by SIAST's International Registration Services Representative in consultation with the relevant program head. Registrar approval will be required.</p>
<p>Advanced Placement (AP) English</p>	<p>Successful completion of Grade 12 at an English-speaking high school, including Advanced Placement English courses, each with a minimum grade of 3</p>
<p>International Baccalaureate (IB) English A1 or A2</p>	<p>Successful completion of the International Baccalaureate Diploma, including higher level English with a minimum grade of 4</p>
<p>Other equivalent proofs of proficiency</p>	<p>Proficiency equivalents are reviewed by SIAST's International Admissions Representative in consultation with the relevant program head. Recommendations are submitted to the Registrar for final approval. Applicants may appeal to the Registrar decisions concerning English language proficiency requirements.</p>

Canadian and U.S. high schools	Completion of grades 11 and 12 English, in sequence, as part of two full academic years, in a high school using a provincially- or state-accredited Canadian or U.S. curriculum OR a grade of 80% or better in a grade 12 provincially-examined English course, as part of one full term of study
English-Language Post-Secondary	Successful completion of at least 24 credit hours in an approved English-language post-secondary institution, including at least 6 credit hours in humanities or social science subjects and with a grade point average of 60.00% or equivalent
GCSE/IGCSE/GCE	GCSE/IGCSE/GCE Ordinary Level English, English Language, or English as a Second Language with minimum grade of 'B' or GCE A/AS/AICE Level English or English Language with minimum grade of 'C'
One of the following tests also will be accepted. Test results must be received, by the Admissions Office, directly from the testing service.
